# Report of the 12th meeting of the Technical Working Group (TWG) on Disaster-related Statistics: 29 September 2021, 13:00 - 15:30 hours (Bangkok time)

### **Summary of group discussions:**

Workshop on Catalyzing the Policy Impetus for Disaster-related Statistics to understand the core elements of a Policy on disaster-related statistics, the basic steps for implementation and perceived challenges in the development process:

#### Core Elements of a Policy on disaster-related statistics:

- 1. A clear and authoritative mandate, whether in the form of a resolution, legislation as basis to start the work.
- Well-defined delineation of duties and responsibilities and division of work among the stakeholders
- 3. Involvement of data producers and users in the entire process.
- 4. Technical framework to include definition and standards, data sources and appropriate protocols.

## Basic steps in developing the Policy:

- 1. Initiation of the process brought about by urgency (frequent disasters); obligation or directive from authorities of relevant government agencies; regional and global commitments to implement disaster-related frameworks.
- 2. Designation of a core agency (NSO or NDMO) to lead the process, serve as custodian and source of official disaster-related statistics in the country.
- 3. The platform (IAC, TWG, Ad Hoc committee) by which this initiative will be carried out should set it in action; bring all the relevant stakeholders into this group.
- 4. Carry on/implement the usual policy-making requirements, processes and procedures. (Can look into examples of Indonesia and the Philippines)

#### Supporting and hindering factors for developing such a Policy:

- 1. Legal framework: identifies the regulation/legislation in place
- 2. Institutional framework: who is responsible for what
- 3. Partnership framework: available guidelines for countries to follow; recommendations of experts
- 4. Challenges include lack of technical knowledge on disaster-related statistics in the NSO; the need for financial and manpower resources since this will be a new undertaking; and issues on designation of required data; data sharing and confidentiality and data liability among data source agencies.
