# Concerns regarding Data for monitoring and reporting

SDGs are very broad and massive

From

MDGs
8 Goals
20 Targets
60 Indicators

SDGs
17 Goals
169 Targets
300 Indicators

- It will be difficult to monitor, track, and report the actual progress
- There are new elements that are overlapping

### Challenges for Bangladesh



### Challenges in Disaster Statistics

- The main challenge for monitoring disasters is in SDGs' expansive scope where the goals cover a vast range of issues
- Disaster statistics will require collection of large amounts of different types of data involving a host of metrics from across several disciplines
- We need strategy to continuously develop new statistical, monitoring and evaluation capacity

# Challenges for disaster monitoring and reporting

- Disaster data has problems with accessibility, quality, lack precision and timeliness
- Difficult to fix a reference year and baseline
- Requirement for huge resources and for developing new surveys and capacities
- Complex coordination among BBS and other sectors
- Challenge in the coordination while maintaining statistical independence

## How to make the best use of administrative data

- Working closely with Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief
- Data sharing policy: develop MOA between BBS with ministries and agencies on data sharing and integration
- Use electronic data system to build automatic data connection
- Improving survey methods, analysis and forecast

### **Ongoing efforts**

- Forming a National Committee to undertake the pilot testing of a draft Disaster-Related Statistics Framework involving the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief among others;
- Initiating "Settings Priorities for Data Support to 7<sup>th</sup>FYP and SDGs: An Overview by BBS;
- SDGs mapping by the Planning Commission
- Publishing "Bangladesh Disaster-related Statistics 2015: Climate Change and Natural Disaster Perspectives" based on a 150,000 household samples survey to build a baseline
- Publishing the result of DRSF with Fiji, Indonesia and the Philippines
- Preparing "Bangladesh Environmental Statistics Framework 2016-2030" to align all of the required monitoring and reporting to ensure that they are not to be burdensome to the national statistical system.
