Strong demand for a gender angle in disasters and climate change statistics and analysis

Both issues covered in global goals
Data from a gender perspective largely missing

Disaster and climate change statistics from a gender perspective in Asia and the Pacific

Identify priority areas and indicators

- Regional meeting provided inputs in terms of priority areas and related indicators
- Global frameworks (SDGs, Sendai, UNFCCC)
- Suggested list circulated for feedback
- Structured around DSRF as this is a regional product
- Additional area on drivers to capture CC

Group work on next steps

- Consensus on the need to agree on a set of common indicators
- Consensus on the need to develop a glossary with metadata
- Create a steering committee/Task team
- In-depth review of existing data
- Workshop to identify gaps and see how to improve/review existing work
- Capacity building to engender policy documents that regulate data collection on DRR - CC
- Capacity building for NSOs and NDRMOs on how to use statistical tools to produce gender data
- Strengthen user-producer coordination
- Learn how to interpret and use gender data on climate change and disasters
