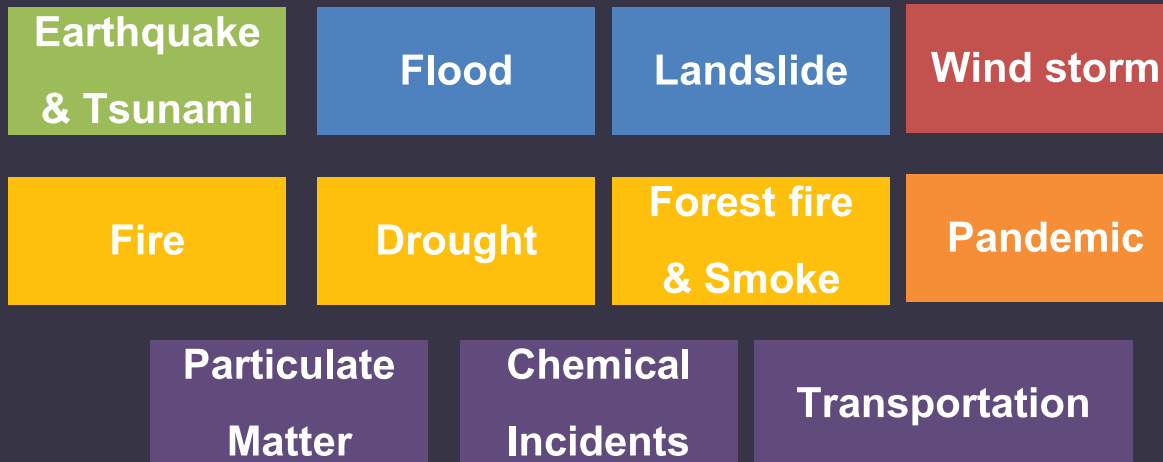

Definition & Disaster type

Thailand

Disaster : means any of these disasters; fire, storm, strong wind, flood, drought, epidemic in human, epidemic in animals, epidemic in aquaculture, and epidemic in plants and other public disaster either natural disasters or human-made disasters, accidents or all other incidents that effect to life, body or properties of the people, of the government. And in this regards, air threats and sabotages are also included



Level of disaster

Level of disaster in Thailand divided 4 levels :

Level	Management	Authority to announce the area where disaster occurs
1	Small	Provincial Director / Bangkok Metropolitan Administration Director
2	Medium	Provincial Director / Bangkok Metropolitan Administration Director
3	Large	Head of the National Disaster Prevention and Mitigation Committee (NDPMC)
4	Extremely serious	Prime Minister or the Deputy Prime Minister whom the Prime Minister entrusted

Flood

An overflow or accumulation of an expanse of water that submerges land. It is usually due to heavy rainfall events produce a large volume of water within a body of water such as river or canal, exceeding the total capacity of the body, and as a result, some of the water flows or sets outside the normal perimeter of the body. In addition, human activities such as blocking the natural flow of water either intentionally or unintentionally can produce flood, often causing significant fatalities and material and environmental damage. Flooding can be classified according to their inherent characteristics as follow :

(1) Inundation/Overbank flow

(2) Flash flood
